Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Thanksgiving is so underrated, but we pray you were all able to find time to be with family and to be thankful together. Certainly, this is not the only time we reflect with grateful hearts, but it is a time to be purposeful about it. From the Old Testament to the New Testament, we are reminded to be thankful always.

Psalm 107:1, "Oh give thanks to the Lord, for He is good, for His lovingkindness is everlasting."

1 Thessalonians 5:18, "In everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

We are indeed a thankful church. We are thankful for God's Word and intervention in our lives, and for His grace and mercy on sinners who do not deserve it. We are thankful for baptisms, new members, and new babies being born. We are thankful for roofs that no longer leak. We are thankful for the opportunity to celebrate 65 years of ministry here as Westmont Christian Church.

We are thankful for the *Good News Club*, where we have seen an incredible number of volunteers loving on kids and proclaiming the Gospel to them weekly. So far this school year, we have been able to witness nine children pray to accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior! These kids are learning and growing in God's Word, and it is exciting to see and hear what they remember and know. This is truly an exciting ministry opportunity to be involved in. We are thankful to all who seek to see this church grow and thrive. The Future Focus Campaign is evidence of this. We look forward to what God will do through His people in caring for the congregation as we come to the close of 2024. This campaign will help us to start the new year in a positive financial position. Please pray about how you can contribute to this campaign before the year ends.

As we enter the Advent season in December, we continue that idea of being grateful for what God has done, is doing, and will do. We get to focus and narrow in our gratitude towards the best thing God has ever done: expressed His love towards us by sending Jesus.

1 John 4:9-10, "By this the love of God was manifested in us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world so that we might live through Him. In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins."

As we approach the celebration of the birth of Christ, we lead up to it with weeks of anticipation which we call Advent. The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word *adventus*, meaning "coming" or "arrival." This season is not only a time to reflect on Christ's first coming into the world as a baby in Bethlehem but also a time to anticipate His second coming in glory. In this sense, the Advent season helps us reflect on God's work in the past, present, and future according to His truth.

The first theme of **Hope** helps us to remember that Jesus is the hope the Jews were waiting for according to the prophesies established in the Old Testament. He fulfills that hope in His birth, life, death, and resurrection. We also still express our hope in Christ's return again and purposefully prepare our hearts with this hope.

The second theme of **Peace** helps us remember what is foretold in the Old Testament, that a Savior was to come to reconcile man back to God and create true peace. Jesus mentions this peace in John 14:27, "Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Do not let your heart be troubled, nor let it be fearful." Jesus brings peace with Him in His coming, and we look forward to the ultimate promise of peace we will experience in eternity.

The third theme of **Joy** focuses on what we all receive through Christ. This is the good news of great joy that the Jews were anticipating as they awaited the coming of the Messiah. Christ continued to bring true joy as He proclaimed God's truth and became the ultimate propitiation for our sins on the cross. This is the joy we receive now and in all eternity because of the person and work of Christ.

The fourth theme of **Love** reminds us of God's love from the beginning of creation. Since the fall, God has God revealed His love to His people, both Jews and gentiles. This love culminates in the incarnation of God on the earth, who goes to the cross because of His love for sinners. The love of God is anticipated and poured out on us through eternity because of the fullness of God's expression of love in Christ. In this way, God's grace and mercy flows forever.

Advent invites Christians to reflect, repent, and prepare their hearts, blending solemnity with the joyful anticipation of celebrating Jesus as the Savior of the world forevermore!




# PROP IS A FLOP!
